What is a Loan Shark?



A 'loan shark' or illegal money lender is a person who lends you money without the legal permission to do so. They lend it to make themselves more money.



They usually make you pay back a lot, lot more than you borrowed. For example, you borrow £10 and will have to pay back £50.



They can be people that you may know, a friend or a friend of a friend. A loan shark can be anybody.



You might have seen them sometimes in places that you go to. Somewhere like the park, the pub or café.



They may seem very friendly and kind and want to help you at first.



Or they could contact you on social media, through Snapchat or Facebook.



You might even see an advert for a loan on a pop up.



A loan shark will not write down what you owe them, and they won't tell you how much you will have to pay back.



They will usually keep on collecting the loan week after week, month after month, year after year.



And if you cannot pay them, they may turn from being very friendly to being very angry.



Sometimes they will ask you to do things you do not want to do, such as stealing or dealing drugs.

Have you borrowed money from the loan shark?



If you have borrowed money from the loan shark, you are **not** in trouble. They are the people that are breaking the law.



Speaking to someone about your situation is the best thing to do as they could give you help and support.



Illegal Money Lending Team

The Illegal Money Lending team investigates and prosecutes those who lend money illegally (loan sharks). They also support people who have borrowed money from a loan shark.

Their teams have specialist investigators and officers who work together to arrest and prosecute loan sharks.

The Illegal Money Lending Team work closely with many different organisations to protect you from illegal money lenders. This includes the police, housing association and advice agencies.
